NATIONAL FOREWORD

This Indian Standard which is identical with IEC 60335-2-25 "Household and similar electrical appliances—Safety—Part 2-25: Particular requirements for microwave ovens, including combination microwave ovens" issued by the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) will be adopted by the Bureau of Indian Standards on the recommendation of the Electrical Appliances Sectional Committee.

This standard was first published in 1994 and revised in 2014. This revision has been undertaken to harmonize with the latest version of IEC 60335-2-25: 2020.

This standard covers the safety requirements of microwave ovens, including combination microwave ovens.

This standard however, does not cover the performance requirements which are covered under a separate standard (*refer* IS 11676).

This part 2 is to be used in conjunction with IS 302-1: 2023, Safety of Household and Similar Electrical Appliances Part 1 General Requirements (Seventh Revision) [Doc: ETD 32 (22184)WC (*Under preparation*)].

NOTE 1— When "Part 1" is mentioned in this standard, it refers to IEC 60335-1.

This part 2 supplements or modifies the corresponding clauses in IS 302-1, so as to convert that publication into the Indian standard: Particular requirements for microwave ovens, including combination microwave ovens.

When a particular subclause of Part 1 is not mentioned in this part 2, that subclause applies as far as is reasonable. When this standard states "addition", "modification" or "replacement", the relevant text in Part 1 is to be adapted accordingly.

NOTE 2— The following numbering system is used:

- a) subclauses, tables and figures that are numbered starting from 101 are additional to those in Part 1;
- b) unless notes are in a new subclause or involve notes in Part 1, they are numbered starting from 101, including those in a replaced clause or

subclause;

c) additional annexes are lettered AA, BB, etc.

NOTE 3— The following print types are used:

- a) requirements: in roman type;
- b) test specifications: in italic type;
- c) notes: in small roman type.

The text of IEC Standard has been approved as suitable for publication as an Indian Standard without deviations. Certain terminologies and conventions are, however, not identical to those used in Indian Standards. Attention is particularly drawn to the following:

- a) Wherever the words 'International Standard' appear referring to this standard, theyshould be read as 'Indian Standard'.
- b) Comma (,) has been used as a decimal marker, while in Indian Standards the current practice is to use a point (.) as the decimal marker.

In this standard, reference appears to International Standards for which Indian Standards also exists. The corresponding Indian Standards, which are to be substituted, are listed below along with their degree of equivalence for the editions indicated:

The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.
