INK, STENCIL, OIL BASE,
FOR MARKING POROUS SURFACES****0. FOREWORD**

0.1 This Indian Standard (First Revision) was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 29 August 1980, after the draft finalized by the Inks and Allied Products Sectional Committee had been approved by the Chemical Division Council.

0.2 This standard was originally published in 1957. The experience gained through the use of this standard has resulted in its revision. In the revised standard, the requirement for fineness of grind, skinning properties and accelerated weathering have been added and the requirements for residue on sieve, non-volatile vehicle, and miscibility with petroleum hydrocarbon solvents have been deleted.

0.3 For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS : 2-1960*. The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard covers the requirements and the methods of sampling and test for ink suitable for application to porous surface, namely, crates, wooden boxes, cardboard cartons and hessian bags.

1.1.1 The ink complying with this specification is suitable for application by stencil brush and stencil board, and by automatic stencilling machine.
