INK, DRAWING, WATERPROOF, BLACK

0. FOREWORD

0.1 This Indian Standard (First Revision) was adopted by the Indian Standards Institution on 1 April 1971, after the draft finalized by the Inks and Allied Products Sectional Committee had been approved by the Chemical Division Council.

0.2 This standard was originally issued in 1955. The Inks and Allied Products Sectional Committee responsible for its preparation decided to revise it in the light of experience gained through its use. Additional tests for accelerated ageing and clogging have been prescribed. Changes have been made in methods of test and sampling procedure.

0.3 In the original standard, a test to detect the presence of dyes was specified. It was felt that since the object of the test was to prevent the use of dyes which might fade after use, a test for permanence of the ink should be specified.

0.4 For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS :2-1960*. The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.

1. SCOPE

1.1 This standard (First Revision) prescribes the requirements and the methods of sampling and tests for ink, drawing, waterproof, black.
